The Rules - NKA and CKRA

- Thompson Kart Raceway is a member track of the National Karting Alliance (NKA). Racing operations are regulated by the NKA Tech Manual unless otherwise noted.
- In the interests of our Club's membership, CKRA class structures deviate from the associated class structures listed in the NKA Tech Manual.
- If any particular exception or deviation is not specifically indicated below, then follow NKA regulations.
- It is the responsibility of the driver/crew chief to know and understand the rules.
- NKA updates their regulations as necessary throughout the year and can be viewed on the NKA website.
- CKRA also reserves the right to update regulations as necessary and will post updates on the CKRA website.

Class Structures - Ages and Engines

- Ages
 - o 5-7 Kid Kart
 - 8-12 Cadet
 - 12-15 Junior
 - 15+ Senior
 - o 35+ Masters
- Engines
 - 4-Cycle
 - Briggs 206 (all classes)
 - o 2-cycle
 - Comer (Kid Kart)
 - IAME Swift (Cadet)
 - KA 100 (Junior and Senior)



Class Structures - Kid Kart

- ages 5 to 7
- Participation class per NKA rules to allow children to learn to race in a friendly, fun environment.
- No season points. Participation awards to each Kid Kart driver.
- Gearing: Chain
 - Comer #219, 10 tooth front sprocket, 89 tooth rear sprocket
 - 206 #35 chain, 17 tooth front sprocket, 57 tooth rear sprocket
- Tire size 10 x 450 or 460 x 5 with maximum rear tire circumference of 33.75"
- Weight:
 - Option One: Minimum 150 lbs. for Kart with Comer 50/51cc
 - Option Two: Minimum 170 lbs for Kart with Briggs 206



Class Structures - 206 Cadet

- ages 8 to 12
- Engine: Briggs Racing 206
- Exhaust: RLV pipe (#5506, #5507)
- Weight
 - <u>Option One</u> Minimum 255 lbs. must use Red slide (#555733) in Carburetor with carb lock
 - <u>Option Two</u> Minimum 295 lbs. must use Green slide (#555740) in Carburetor with carb lock
 - Maximum kart only weight (without driver) for Green slide is 205 lbs.
- Spec Tire:
 - MOJO D2
 - MG RED SH or SH2
 - Hoosier R60B
 - Vega Red
- NKA bodywork rules

Class Structures - 206 Junior

- ages 12 to 15
- Engine: Briggs Racing 206
- Exhaust: RLV pipe (#5506, #5507)
- Weight
 - Option One Minimum 300 lbs. must use Blue slide (#555734) in Carburetor with carb lock
 - Option Two Minimum 320 lbs. must use Yellow slide (#555741) in Carburetor with carb lock
- Spec Tire:
 - MOJO D2
 - MG RED SH or SH2
 - Hoosier R60B
 - Vega Red
- NKA bodywork rules
- CKRA reserves the right to make adjustments to class specs in the interest of maintaining equality.



Class Structures - 206 Senior

- ages 15 and up
- Engine: Briggs Racing 206
- Exhaust: RLV pipe (#5506, #5507)
- Weight
 - Option One Minimum 360 lbs. must use Green coil
- Spec Tire:
 - MOJO D2
 - MG RED SH or SH2
 - Hoosier R60B
 - $\circ \quad \text{Vega Red}$
- NKA bodywork rules Gold Cup or CIK
- CKRA reserves the right to make adjustments to class specs in the interest of maintaining equality.



Class Structures - 206 Masters

- ages: 35+
- Engine: Briggs Racing 206
- Exhaust: RLV pipe (#5506, #5507)
- Weight: 385lbs
- Spec Tire:
 - MOJO D2
 - MG RED SH or SH2
 - Hoosier R60B
 - $\circ \quad \text{Vega Red}$
- NKA bodywork rules Gold Cup or CIK
- CKRA reserves the right to make adjustments to class specs in the interest of maintaining equality.
- Drivers 18 years and older who are over 200lbs. can request an age waiver.



Class Structures - 2-cycle Cadet

- ages 8 to 12
- IAME Micro Swift
- Weight: 250#
- Micro ROK
- Weight: 255#
- Yamaha is welcome to run (235#), but parity will not be possible.
- CKRA reserves the right to make adjustments to class specs in the interest of maintaining parity.
- Spec Tire: MG RED SH or SH2



Class Structures - 2-cycle Junior

- ages 12 to 15
- IAME KA100
- Weight 320
- 22mm IAME Exhaust Restrictor
- Spec Tire: MG RED SH or SH2



Class Structures - 2-cycle Senior

- ages 15 and up
- Option One
 - IAME KA100
 - Weight 370 lbs.
- Option Two
 - Yamaha KT100S
 - Weight 345 lbs.
 - Exhaust SR-Y Pipe
- Clutch is mandatory
- Spec Tire: MG RED SH or SH2
- NKA bodywork rules CIK
- CKRA reserves the right to make adjustments to class specs in the interest of maintaining equality.



Class Structure - Novice

- This group will be run on an as-needed basis to provide a place for new participants to learn to race without the hazard of running with seasoned veterans.
- The group can be comprised of 2-Cycle and 206 drivers of the same age group.
- Scoring Finishing position will be as if they finished at the tail end of the appropriate class. For example, if there were 6 entries in the Cadet 2-cycle class, the highest finishing Cadet 2-cycle in the Novice Group would receive 7th place points for the day, and so on with any other Cadet 2-cycle. The same practice would apply to the Cadet Briggs 206 in that Novice Group.
- This concept can be applied to any class if the number of entries warrant its use.

 - Additional cost Professional Engine Blueprinting (\$700-900)
 - Complete used Kart (\$2300-\$3600)

 - \$3000-\$4900 for a 4-cycle "roller"
 - \$4000-\$5500 for a 2-cycle "roller"
- Engine (new)
 - Briggs 206 (4 Cycle)
 - Complete Pkg \$950-1070 (engine, mount, exhaust, chain guard, air filter, exhaust)
 - Additional cost-Professional engine preparation (\$250-\$450)
 - Complete used kart (\$1800-3500)
 - IAME KA100 (2-Cycle)
 - Pkg \$2795 (Electrical, Pipe, Airbox)
 - Engine mount \$110-\$250
 - Additional cost Professional Engine Blueprinting (\$700-900)
- Complete used Karts
 - 4-cycle \$1800-\$3500
 - 2-cycle \$4000-\$6500

 - Abrasion resistant driver suit or Jeans and Abrasion resistant Jacket
 - Closed-toe shoes
 - Neck Brace
- Kid Kart, Cadet
 - Rated chest protector

 - Rib brace



- Warm-ups
 - Begin promptly at 10am
 - Two 5-minute sessions
 - Order to be determined day of and can be changed week-to-week based upon family needs.
- 10 minute break after final kart is off the track
- Drivers Meeting
 - Kid Karts come to meeting with Karts ready to race
- National Anthem
- Heats OR Qualifying/Pre-Final
 - to begin immediately following National Anthem
 - 5 minutes +2 laps
 - race ready racing as soon as track is clear, next group takes the track
- Kid Kart Final 7 minutes +2 laps
- Intermission 30 Minutes
- Finals
 - 7 minutes +2 laps
 - race ready racing
